



WELCOME TO UNC CHARLOTTE

We hope you enjoy this self-guided walking tour, which offers a general overview of our beautiful, modern campus. We invite you to stop at any building, classroom, residence hall, campus dining area or recreational facility, even those not directly on the walking tour path. If you are visiting on a typical class day, you will get a better idea of student and campus life.

DAILY CAMPUS TOURS

- » Student-guided daily campus tours are available Monday through Friday and select Saturdays with an advance reservation on our website.
- » For more information about student-guided tours and other campus visit experiences, go to admissions.charlotte.edu/visit.

BEGINNING YOUR SELF-GUIDED TOUR

- » This walking tour has been designed to take approximately one hour.
- » Start your tour at the Gage Undergraduate Admissions Center and follow the numbered stops.
- » Return back to the Gage Undergraduate Admissions Center using the Gold Niner Transit Bus Stop #34 across from the light rail station.
- » On your way out, we encourage you to drive along the perimeter of campus to see additional residence halls, academic buildings and the football stadium.

OUR HISTORY

- » UNC Charlotte is one of a generation of universities founded in metropolitan areas of the United States immediately after World War II in response to rising education demands generated by the war.
- » Originally started in 1946 as an evening college center named The Charlotte Center, the institution later evolved into Charlotte College in 1949, offering the first two years of college courses.
- » In 1961, Charlotte College moved its growing student body into two new buildings on what became our current 1,000-acre campus.
- » In 1965, the North Carolina legislature approved bills making Charlotte College a four-year, state-supported college, creating the University of North Carolina at Charlotte. UNC Charlotte is now the fastest growing university in the UNC System.

GETTING AROUND CAMPUS

Most students walk, bike or skateboard to class, but Charlotte also offers a variety of quick transportation across campus

- » **Charlotte's Niner Transit buses** are free of charge and operate every day, except when the University is closed. Download the UNCC NextRide mobile app or visit nextridge.charlotte.edu.
- » **Zipcar rentals** offer on-campus car rentals by the hour or by the day.
- » **Gotcha Mobility** provides affordable, short-term bike and e-scooter rentals.

CAMPUS SAFETY

- » **UNC Charlotte Police & Public Safety** is a fully authorized state police agency, providing 24/7 police and security service to the campus.
- » **Blue Light emergency phones** are placed strategically throughout campus providing the student community with an easy, reliable way to report a crime.
- » **The LiveSafe App** provides access to campus emergency resources and a direct line of communication with students and the police via text and phone services.

NEW ADDITIONS

UNC CHARLOTTE MARRIOTT HOTEL AND CONFERENCE CENTER

- » The full-service hotel and conference center provides a welcoming space for generations of 49ers and Charlotteans. The hotel features more than 220 hotel rooms and 24,000 square feet of conference space.

THE SCIENCE BUILDING

- » This state of the art facility features instructional and research laboratories, classroom space and is home to the chemistry, biology and physics departments.

Our proximity to the city of Charlotte gives students many opportunities to explore, study and research in one of America's fastest growing economies. Whether you're interested in the arts, music, sports, history, dining, shopping or just sightseeing, there's something for you in Charlotte.

- » **Major League Sports:** Carolina Panthers (NFL), Charlotte Hornets (NBA), Charlotte Checkers Hockey (ECHL), Charlotte Motor Speedway (NASCAR), Charlotte Knights (MiLB) and Charlotte Football Club (MLS)
- » **Outdoors/Attractions:** Carowinds Amusement Park, Blumenthal Performing Arts Center, Great Wolf Lodge & Waterpark, Topgolf Charlotte, U.S. National White Water Center, museums and more

SELF-GUIDED CAMPUS TOUR



1 GAGE UNDERGRADUATE ADMISSIONS & SOUTH VILLAGE

- » **South Village Crossing (SoVi):** All-you-care-to-eat dining
- » **Laurel & Hunt Hall:** Residence halls featuring suite-style living
- » **Holshouser & Sanford Hall:** Residence halls with traditional two-person rooms
- » **Scott Hall:** First-year student residence hall with traditional two-person rooms



2 LEVINE HALL, HONORS COLLEGE & HOUSING & RESIDENCE LIFE

- » **Levine Hall:** Residence hall featuring suites and apartments and home to the administrative offices and classrooms for the Honors College and Levine Scholars program
- » **Housing & Residence Life:** Home to administrative offices for on-campus living



3 ROBINSON HALL, STORRS & ROWE

- » **Robinson Hall:** Performing arts, dance, music and theatre
- » **Storrs:** College of Arts + Architecture studios and classrooms
- » **Rowe:** Art department, art galleries with rotating exhibits, sculpture courtyard, choral rehearsal hall, instrumental studio, photography labs and art studios



4 J. MURREY ATKINS LIBRARY

- » Open 24 hours Sunday-Thursday, with varying hours on Friday and Saturday and 24/7 during exam weeks
- » Home to a multitude of resources including computer workstations, lending laptops, private group study rooms, electronic journals and journal databases
- » Peet's Library Café is located on the ground floor
- » Research librarians are on site to assist students



5 KING, REESE & CONE UNIVERSITY CENTER

- » **King & Reese:** Offices including Human Resources, Student Employment, Financial Aid and the Dean of Students
- » **Cone University Center:** Named after Miss Bonnie Cone, the founder of UNC Charlotte, and contains Subway, Panda Express and Main Street Market
- » **Niner Central:** Central resource for services related to financial aid, billing, registration and transcripts



6 BARNHARDT STUDENT ACTIVITY CENTER, GOLDEN NUGGET & STAR QUAD

- » **Barnhardt Student Activity Center (SAC):** 9,000-seat Halton Arena, home to 49er basketball and volleyball
- » **Golden Nugget:** Rub the Golden Nugget outside the student entrance of the SAC for good luck
- » **Star Quad:** Compass-shaped mosaic design on the ground that is a popular spot for outdoor events and activities like the annual National Pan-Hellenic Council yard show during fall Gold Rush

7 CHHS/COED PLAZA, WOODWARD, COED & CHHS

- » **CHHS/COED Plaza:** Throw a penny in the Norm Statue's pan for good luck
- » **Woodward Hall:** Home to the College of Computing & Informatics and Biological Sciences
- » **Cato College of Education (COED):** Home to education, foreign language, culture studies and counseling
- » **College of Health & Human Services (CHHS):** Home to nursing, public health, social work, kinesiology and health systems management

8 UNIVERSITY RECREATION CENTER (UREC)

- » 148,000 square foot building dedicated to student recreation and fitness
- » Features indoor pool, outdoor pool, multi-purpose courts, group fitness studios, cycling studio, elevated running/walking track, cardio and strength training equipment and a demo kitchen

9 POPP MARTIN STUDENT UNION

- » Ranked as one of the top college unions in the nation!
- » Features University bookstore, movie theater, food court, Crown Commons dining hall, hair salon, NinerTech store, student ID office, student organization and activities offices and group meeting spaces

10 NORTH VILLAGE

- » **Miltimore, Wallace, Witherspoon & Belk Hall:** Residence halls featuring suite-style and apartment-style living
- » **Lynch Hall:** First-year student residence hall featuring suite-style living and home to many Learning Communities

11 LIGHT RAIL

- » Connects students to Uptown Charlotte for internships and entertainment
- » Provides easy access to the region's performing arts, athletic events, festivals and other activities
- » Students have unlimited access to light rail by showing their student ID cards

ON YOUR WAY OUT, THERE'S MORE TO SEE... Follow the driving path as you leave campus

- » **Athletic facilities:** Irwin Belk Track & Field, Tennis Courts, Phillips Field and Daughtridge Stadium
- » **McColl-Richardson Football Stadium:** 15,000-seat stadium
- » **Albert and Freeman Energy Production & Infrastructure Center (EPIC), Grigg Hall, Duke Hall, Kulwicki Lab, Motorsports Research and Bioinformatics:** Academic buildings primarily for engineering majors

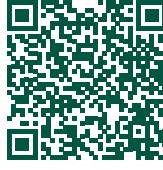

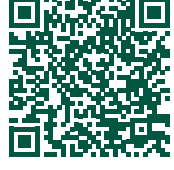
